8. REPORTS FROM OFFICERS

- a. Report from Police Chief: Chief Kelly reported that there was no rotation associated with the storm above, it was just ending and there was some reports of flooding. The department has had some good busts with the K-9 unit however Officer Harris was injured today so he'll be out of commission for a few weeks. Siren tests were today and went well; there are two new Reserve Officers in CLEET training, Josh Simpson and Wes Savory. The Police Department is on lockdown due to officers being killed across the country and there have been threats to the Stillwater Police Department that have come in through teletype. The new Police SUV has arrived, if you haven't come down to see it you should do so.
- b. Report from City Manager: Mr. Smitherman provided a copy of his report to the commissioners. Staff has been doing safety training. Needs are being determined with the street project, some streets are currently being bowmagged. A request letter will be sent to Payne County for reimbursement of \$1600 towards the purchase of fire hydrants. There were 5 water meters replaced today, there was a line that busted due to pressure build up. They have replaced 42 water meters and are at about 95% of where they need to be. The Chet Baker Festival is coming up and news articles have been advertising the event. They are going to raise Miss Liberty about 4' in the park, please call about any issues in town because we don't always get all the information.

9. COMMISSIONER COMMENTS

- **a.** Report from Commissioner Strader: Would like to see an article in the paper about what's going on in town. Also will there be clean-up for the Chet Baker Festival? Mr. Smitherman added that he had spoken to Linda Frick about the Jim Thorpe Park sign and she said just put up a sign.
- **b. Report from Vice Mayor Adsit:** There are signs on the highway for the last year that have been crooked and faded. The faded signs need to be taken down and the crooked signs need to straighten. The 3rd Street rail north of the 4-way stop has been missing for two years and it's time to get something done. There are still tires and wheels setting in front of the armory, this is not a storage area. Jay has done a good job on the meters but he only needs to be installing meters, nothing else.
- c. Report from Commissioner Mendenhall: There is a raised manhole at the far end of West Beaumont from bowmagging the streets, there are still barricades up but why it is still there? North on C Street, the 25 mph school sign is hidden and you can't hardly see it, someone needs to cut brush in that area. On the 3rd Street bridge there are cones on the West side near the new railing but not on the East side where there is no railing, is there any reason for that? The cones need to be picked up from the clearing of trees. There are deceased people on our aging list, what can we do about it? Has the Veterinarian Dr. McNeil been scheduled, Mr. Smitherman stated that the spay and neuter clinic had been scheduled for November 7 from 9am 12 pm. Are we completely out of asphalt? Back to the railing on 3rd Street, didn't the city receive an insurance check on the railing for repair of the bridge?

- **e. Report from Mayor Baker:** The drains are plugged up at Boston and D Street and the water is flowing to Main Street. This needs to be addressed.
