5. PUBLIC APPEARANCES

- a. Jennifer Rogers with Oklahoma Municipal Power Authority Ms. Rogers provided an update on the new rate design for billing through OMPA. They also have a new 50/50 residential ceiling insulation rebate program that the city could vote to participate in. Palma Lough from OMPA will be up in the next few weeks to discuss new programs that are available. There are still energy rebate programs and an energy auditor program. Fort Supply and Moreland were both cities that were added this year, Cordell will be coming on in 2016; that will be a total of 42 cities with OMPA. There will be an upcoming resolution that OMPA will be asking their member cities to pass in the next few months. It's a PURPA Resolution, Public Utility Regulatory Policy Act, this would allow OMPA to handle anything that would fall under this on the cities behalf. There is a possible upcoming rate increase due to power plant upgrades, it will probably be below 3%, the numbers are still being finalized.
- b. Randy James with Data Technologies Our company has been in business about 30 years, we have about 730 customers in the Midwest. There have been a few water leaks recently, the one in front of the school we're still looking at. Hopefully you'll look at the water usage for November, we're under for the month.
